- Water Quality Testing Fluorometer.  
Fluorometers measure the fluorescence of algae, dyes or pollutants in the water. This measurement can be used for dye tracing studies, turbidity dredge monitoring, pollutant tracing or estimating concentrations of phytoplankton and cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) for bloom predictions.  
Estimated cost: \$500 - \$2,500
- ESRI ArcGIS Platform (Geographic Information System)  
This platform/program is an interactive mapping and analyzing data system. Training and database are also requested. Estimated cost: \$3,500 - \$7,000 or in-kind support.

- \$100 – Provides a senior with meals for one month through the Meals on Wheels program.
- \$250 – Pays for driving lessons for workforce development program participants.
- \$500 - Adopt a Family for the holidays and provide gifts that would be beyond reach for a family that has been a recipient of Rental and Mortgage Assistance from Interfaith Neighbors
- \$1,500 – One month’s rent or mortgage payment for a working family facing homelessness.
- \$2,500 – Purchases a kitchen and washer/dryer appliance package for a newly constructed affordable home.

The Arc of Monmouth supports and empowers individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) to live, work, and participate in their communities. We believe that people with disabilities are defined by their individual strengths, their abilities, and their dreams – not by their challenges.

The Arc serves over 1,600 individuals in Monmouth County, providing employment, vocational, and educational services, adult training, residential and independent living programs, behavioral health care, social services and an abundance of enriching recreational activities.

### SUPPORTS FOR GERIATRIC POPULATION WITH INTELLECTUAL/DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

- Hospital Beds – (4) - \$1000 each Three for residents at Columbia Manor, one for Virginia Manor.
- Seat Lift Recliners – (22) - \$500 each A total of 22 seat lift recliners are needed across the agency – ten in residential group homes, eight for the Achievement Centers, and four for the Work Opportunity Center.
- Transport Wheel Chairs – (20) - \$150 each
- 3-in-1 Commodes – (25) - \$140 each
- Roll-in Shower Assist Chairs – (14) - \$125 each
- Specialized Shower Buddy – Roll in Buddy with Tilt– (2) - \$1,600 each
- Portable Generator – (1) - \$600 -Intended in case of emergency for one group home resident who uses a breathing machine overnight.

### ACTIVITIES IN THE ACHIEVEMENT CENTERS – ADULT DAY HABILITATION

- iPads or Tablets – Apple or Android -The primary intended use of these tablets will be to install speech proxy talker apps to increase communication for non-verbal adults with I/DD.
